# REMOTE AREA BORDER CROSSING PERMIT

# THE RABC PERMIT IS VALID FOR THE FOLLOWING REMOTE AREAS:

- · From Pigeon River through to and including Lake of the Woods
- · The Canadian shore of Lake Superior
- · Cockburn Island
- · Sault Ste. Marie (upper lock system)
- · Northwest Angle Area

The RABC (Remote Area Border Crossing) permit, allows the bearer to cross the Border into Canada at the above remote areas without reporting to a port of entry, as long as imported goods are declared.

#### WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO APPLY FOR A RABC PERMIT?

Canadian citizens, permanent residents of Canada, United States citizens and permanent residents of the United States are eligible to apply for a RABC permit.

United States citizens and permanent residents must meet normal visitor legislative requirements, as described under the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act* (IRPA), that is, be in good health, be law abiding and have sufficient funds for their stay in Canada. Applicants may not qualify for a permit if they have been previously charged with a contravention of Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) or Immigration legislation; have criminal convictions for which there has not been a pardon or, if they have provided false or incomplete information on the RABC permit application.

# **PROGRAM CONDITIONS:**

- All persons enrolled in RABC with the exception of children under the age of 5, persons who are medically-contraindicated from getting vaccinated and
  habitual residents of the Northwest Angle who are already exempt from public health measures, are required to be fully vaccinated. Proof must be
  submitted at the time of application. Those who are exempted of vaccination are also exempted from pre-arrival and on-arrival testing
- · Submission of public health information via ArriveCAN prior to each entry into Canada is mandatory.
- Should the definition of fully vaccinated change, permit holders will be required to resubmit their new proof of vaccination to CBSA, including uploading it to ArriveCAN. Permit holders must remain aware of and compliant with current reporting and entry requirements, as they are subject to change.
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- Permit holders are not eligible to enter Canada under the RABC program if they tested positive for COVID in the last 10 days or have symptoms of COVID-19.
- · Permit holders entering Canada are exempt from mandatory randomized testing.
- Permit holders cannot travel to other parts of Canada without reporting in to a POE.
- · RABC permits are valid only for the remote areas listed above and may not be used to cross the border in any other location.
- Individuals crossing at any other location in Canada should consult our Web site at <a href="www.cbsa-asfc.gc.ca">www.cbsa-asfc.gc.ca</a> to learn about an alternate reporting program for your area.
- All persons travelling on board a conveyance must have their RABC permit in their possession when they cross the border into Canada at the remote
  areas identified above. Individuals who are not in possession of a RABC permit, or whose permit has expired must enter at a port of entry. Verifications
  will be conducted periodically.
- RABC permit holders entering to work in Canada must be in possession of a valid work permit where applicable under the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act* (IRPA).
- RABC permit holders entering at a CBSA office open for business will not be exempted from the normal examination process. Dependents travelling separately must have a copy of the CANPASS - RABC permit in their possession.
- All restricted and prohibited firearms must be registered and presented to the CBSA at a port of entry prior to being brought into Canada. Forms are

  into Canada, please check our Web site at <a href="https://www.cbsa-asfc.gc.ca">www.cbsa-asfc.gc.ca</a> or call the CBSA office nearest you.
- RABC permit holders, who are importing goods that will remain in Canada, or who are importing goods over their personal exemption entitlement, must contact a CBSA office prior to departing from the United States and provide a full description and value of all such goods. A border services officer will issue a reference number to the RABC permit holders and will advise them of the steps they must follow when they arrive in Canada.



## Identity documents required

- Passport: submit a PHOTOCOPY of the pages bearing your photograph and signature. No further documentation is required if you submit your passport.
- If you do not have a passport, each person 18 years and over MUST provide two pieces of identification: one primary AND one secondary document.
   Photocopies of identification documents are acceptable. DO NOT mail original documents.
- Each child under 18 years of age need only provide a primary document.
- Custodial parents or Legal guardians must attach a copy of supporting documents, such as court order or letter of authorization if this application is for a child under 18 years of age who will be travelling with a non-custodial adult.
- · Submit identification every time you apply for an RABC Permit. DO NOT mail original documents

## **PROCESSING FEE**

#### By Mail:

- The CAN \$30 per application processing fee includes the principal applicant plus qualifying family members (see below).
- The processing fee is waived for Principal Applicants UNDER 18 years of age.
- · The processing fee is NOT refundable.
- CAN \$30 payable by Visa, MasterCard or American Express ONLY.

## In person at a CBSA office:

- · The processing fee may be paid in cash, credit card, debit card, or a cheque drawn from a Canadian Financial Institution.
- · Please note that cheques drawn from United States bank accounts are not acceptable.

# **QUALIFYING FAMILY MEMBERS**

- The family consist of a principal applicant plus spouse (includes a common law partner or same sex partner who have lived with principal applicant for one or more years) and children UNDER 18 years of age. Children under 18 must be children of the applicant, applicant's spouse or of legal guardianship to applicant.
- Please list all children under 18 years of age that may be travelling to Canada in the next year. Dependents CANNOT be added after the RABC permit
  has been processed.

#### By mail

At least 4-6 weeks in advance of your trip, mail the completed application and PHOTOCOPIES of the supporting documentation to: Canada Border Services Agency

You will receive a response by mail, unless an interview is deemed necessary. You MUST have a copy of your RABC permit on your person when travelling.

## In person

The completed application and supporting documentation can be presented to a Border Services Officer at one of the following Canada Border Services Agency offices by appointment only. A limited number of appointments are available.

- · Pigeon River Port of Entry Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday between 0800 2000 hrs. Clients are to call 807-964-3000 to make an appointment.
- Sault Ste. Marie Port of Entry Tuesday and Wednesday between 0800 2000 hrs. Clients are to call 705-941-3044 to make an appointment.
- Fort Frances Port of Entry Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday between 0700- 1900. Walk-ins are available, clients are not required to make an
  appointment.

Wait times at ports of entry may vary. During peak travel times and holidays, line-ups can result in significant delays.
