## Application For Salvage Title Or Nonrepairable Title

Upon the sale or transfer of a motor vehicle for which a current Colorado certificate of title has been issued or filed and that has become a salvage vehicle, as defined in section 42-6-102 (17) C.R.S., the purchaser or transferee shall apply for a Salvage Certificate of Title. A Salvage Title may not be issued for off-highway vehicles, snowmobiles, or vehicles classified as a collector's item, horseless carriage, or street rod vehicle at the time of damage.

A Nonrepairable Title may only be issued to vehicles designated as a source of parts or scrap.
