Young Driver Learner Logbook (class C learner licence)

If you are required to comply with the young driver learner logbook requirement, you must lodge your logbook with the Department of Transport and Main Roads for assessment prior to your practical driving test. If your logbook is incomplete or fails the assessment, you will not be eligible to take the test. You must lodge your completed and certified logbook via Australia Post at least 12 business days before your practical driving test. An approved logbook is only valid for three years. Please ensure your logbook approval is current and contact the department if you are unsure. The department will notify you when your logbook has been assessed and passed. Test appointment checklist

You are reminded that it is an offence to drive unaccompanied on a learner licence. If you will be driving a vehicle to the testing centre, you must be accompanied at that time by a person who holds and has held an open licence for the class of vehicle for at least one year.

Your arrival time at the testing centre

- You must arrive at your appointment time **10 minutes** prior to your driving test time at the centre named above. ☐

What to bring with you:

- your current Queensland learner licence or any other driver licence held by you that allows you to drive the test vehicle ☐
- this Driving Test Appointment Sheet with the 'Accredited driver trainer's details' (if applicable) and the 'Registered operator's authorisation for the Driving Examiner to drive the test vehicle and release and indemnity' sections fully completed. The registered operator of the test vehicle **must authorise the Driving Examiner to drive the vehicle, if required**. (Note in most cases the registered operator will be the owner of the vehicle) ☐
- L plates. (For vehicles - one L plate must be at the front and one L plate at the rear. For motorbikes - one L plate at the rear of the motorbike or the rider may wear a vest displaying an L sign). You are responsible for providing the vehicle for the test ☐
- completed Driver Licence Application/Renewal form (F3000) with supporting evidence of identity documentation as stated on the application ☐
- coloured P plates (as required), but only if you wish to drive your vehicle after passing the practical driving test. (Note: High powered vehicle restrictions apply to some provisional licence holders under the age of 25 years). ☐

Registered operator's authorisation for the Driving Examiner to drive the test vehicle and release and indemnity (please PRINT)

If you hold an overseas driver licence, you must also bring the following with you:

Important information for overseas driver licence holders

If you do not pass your practical driving test you can no longer drive in Queensland using your overseas licence. You may use your overseas licence to undertake another driving test or apply for a Queensland Learner Licence to continue to learn to drive.

The test vehicle

The test vehicle must meet the following minimum vehicle standards:

- be currently registered and be in a legal roadworthy condition
- have seat belts fitted in accordance with Australian Design Rules
Note: Motor cars manufactured prior to 1969, trucks manufactured prior to 1977 and certain omnibuses, which have not been modified in any way, are not required to have seat belts fitted.
- if the vehicle is a convertible, have the roof up
- if the vehicle has a Gross Vehicle Mass (GVM) over 12 tonnes, it must carry three portable triangular red reflectorised warning signs
- for class LR, MR or HR truck tests, the test vehicle must be a rigid truck. A bobtail prime mover is not acceptable
- for class LR bus test, the test vehicle must be more than 4.5 tonne GVM but not more than 8 tonne GVM. A bus of 4.5 tonne GVM or less that is built or fitted to carry more than 12 adults (including the driver) is not acceptable for the test.

It is recommended that all applicants being tested for a motorbike licence ensure that they are wearing suitable protective clothing.

If the construction of the test vehicle has been altered from the manufacturer's specifications, you or the registered operator will need to produce suitable evidence that these modifications have been approved.

If the test vehicle is a **dangerous goods** vehicle, such as a petrol tanker, you or the registered operator, must have a certificate issued stating that its tanks have been emptied and flushed for this driving test.

About the Q-SAFE Practical driving test

- The Q-SAFE practical driving test has been designed to evaluate your ability to drive safely and correctly in different driving situations which may include a variety of speed zones.
- The Driving Examiner will be asking you to undertake a series of driving tasks throughout the test. You will be given clear directions and ample time to perform these tasks.
- If the Driving Examiner does not give you any specific directions during the on-road drive, please just follow the road and be directed by road signs, signals and markings. You will be expected to perform the driving tasks when conditions are safe and in accordance with the road rules.
- At no time during the assessment will the Driving Examiner ask you to perform any driving tasks that are illegal. The Driving Examiner will mark the assessment report form as you drive.
- If your vehicle is fitted with blind spot mirrors, you are still required to conduct shoulder checks to ensure there are no vehicles in the blind spot.
- If you have any questions you should refer these to the Driving Examiner before your test commences. Once the test has commenced, the Driving Examiner will not answer any questions that may influence your driving performance.
- Following your test drive the Driving Examiner will give you an assessment report form and explain the markings. You may have a third person (such as your driver trainer) present to hear this explanation.

Your driving test fee will not be refunded if:

- Your young driver learner logbook (if required) has not been assessed and passed by the department. ☐
- You fail to arrive at the test centre for your driving test at the allotted test time. ☐
- You fail to give **at least two working day's notice** that you wish to cancel your test or alter your allotted test time. ☐
- You are unable to start the test at the allotted time. (that is, late arrival, learner licence not correct, L plates are not displayed, no or incomplete 'Examiner's authority to drive the test vehicle' section, defective vehicle). ☐
